I'm sure they struggled just as we do today, and I'm sure they groaned, grumbled and wrestled with all that was happening, but what kept transforming their outlook was looking from their situation to the God who was with them. They kept trusting that God would make a difference while not always knowing how.

The phrase that appears again and again in the New Testament is GOD IS ABLE:

He is able to help us (Hebrews 2.18)

He is able to save (Hebrews 7.25)

He is able to keep you from falling (Jude 24)

He is able to guard what I have entrusted to him for that day (2 Timothy 1.12)

He who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine (Ephesians 3.20)

For all the negative things we have to say to ourselves, God has positive answers:

We say: It's impossible

God says: All things are possible (Luke 18.27)

We say: I'm too tired.

God says: I will give you rest (Matthew 11.28-30)

We say: I can't go on

God says: My grace is sufficient (2 Corinthians 12.9)

We say: I feel all alone

God says: I will never leave you or forsake you (Hebrews 13.5)

As we begin to journey into 2021 let's remember and remind one another that GOD IS ABLE.
