

CRISP PACKET SLEEPING BAGS

What is a crisp packet sleeping bag?

A sleeping bag made from recycled foil packets for the homeless. Providing warmth from the cold and can be used as a waterproof cover over a regular sleeping bag – a bivvy bag.

Why re-use crisp packets?

Crisp packets are not recyclable

- The shiny foil is made of a Metal Plastic Film and cannot be recycled
- Every day – 20 million crisp packets are produced in the UK
- Every year – over 6 billion crisp packets are consumed in the UK
- It takes up to 1000 years for 1 crisp packet to break-down
- Crisp packets become landfill or end up in the sea which is harmful to wildlife

Why use crisp packets for the homeless?

- The shiny foil reflects heat and keeps the body warm – providing shelter from the cold

Walkers foil crisp packets make the best insulation

- The plastic cover is waterproof – providing shelter from the rain
- A crisp packet lasts 30 years in the sea – so is a hard-wearing material
- Provides protection of belongings from rain and all weathers
- Can also be used as a bivvy bag – by putting a regular sleeping bag inside!
